Discussion Questions:

- 1. How was Sa'laLEla's life the same as yours and how was it different?
- 2. How would you feel about a life where you made art everyday and had as much freedom as Sa'laLEla'?
- 3. Have you ever made any mistakes like Sa'laLEla' did with the women in his village?

Jeopardy questions:

For 100 points:

- **Kwakwaka'wakw:** Did the tribe have a written language: No
- Sa'laLEla: Where did Sa'laLEla live: Northwest coast or Vancouver Island
- Numaym: Both men and women created what everyday: Art
- **Kwakwaka'wakw:** What was their staple food: Salmon
- **Potlatch:** Why did people throw potlatches: birth or marriage

For 200 points:

- **Sa'laLEla** Sa'laLEla's parents gave him what: Independence
- Numaym: What rank was Sa'laLEla: noble
- Kwakwaka'wakw: What kind of art did women make: woven baskets, ornaments, and blankets
- **Potlatch:** How did Sa'laLEla get his blankets: traded oil
- **Kwakwaka'wakw:** What was the Kwakiutl's form of money: Blankets
- **Kwakwaka'wakw:** What type of art did men do: woodworking (Masks, benches, totem poles) and painting
- Potlatch: What did the women hang on their door instead of giving away blankets: Masks

For 300 points:

- Numaym: What did Numayms share: Villages
- **Numaym:** Each Numaym had a story about what: Their ancestor
- **Kwakwaka'wakw:** The Kwakiutl had an abundant what: Food supply
- **Potlatch:** What was Sa'laLEla's role in the potlatch: to collect as many blankets as he could
- **Sa'laLEla**: Sa'laLEla tried to make the women of his tribe do what: give/donate the blankets
- **Kwakwaka'wakw:** Name one skill Sa'laLEla and his siblings learned: carving, weaving, and food preparation

For 400 points:

- **Numaym:** What three classes did Numayms have: Noble families, middle class families, and slaves
- **Potlatch:** What types of activities took place at potlatches: music, feasting, dancing, feats of strength, and something else.
- **Potlatch:** What did hosts give away at potlatches: Blankets and art
- **Sa'laLEla**: Why did the women still bring blankets to the potlatch: they took pity or felt bad for Sa'laLEla
- **Kwakwaka'wakw:**What story did the totem poles tell: Mythical history of ancestors/numayms

Game explained: Each group will have turns to pick a category and difficulty level of question they want to answer (see questions above).
